Social service sector(s) investigated (Erase non relevant ones) • Children/Childcare	France has a long tradition of national family and early childcare policies with a quite complex multi-governance implementation process. In this regard, local authorities and local providers of childcare services retain to a certain extent ability to invest, diversify and innovate within the local childcare system. In the face of growing expectations and demands on childcare services, diversification as well as innovation has been a strategies to combine multiple policy objectives in a context of persistence shortage of places.
